

## Frequently Asked Questions

**1. Do you have to be Catholic to attend St. Paul School?**

No. St. Paul School accepts any family with a child who wishes to attend St. Paul School from any Religious affiliation.

**2. Does St. Paul School offer any type of Financial Aid?**

Yes. If a family belongs to St. Paul Parish and attends Church on a regular basis they will receive a discount on their child's tuition. Parents can also apply to [www.factsmgt.com](http://www.factsmgt.com) as well to see if they qualify for financial assistance.

**3. Does St. Paul School offer Busing?**

Yes. For those students who live in Cranston we offer free busing for those students.

**4. Does St. Paul School offer Virtual Learning/Distance Learning?**

We are able to switch to Virtual learning if needed/or we are mandated to.

**5. Does St. Paul School have a morning or afternoon after-school program?** Yes. We have a morning care program which is available free of charge in the morning from 7:15am to 7:45am. We also offer an after-school program for Grades K-8 from 2:15 pm to 5:30 pm at a cost of \$8.00 hr. Snacks are included with the after-school program at no charge.

**6. What is your student/teacher ratio**

Our Pre-K 3 class is 9:1 and Pre-K 4 is 10:1. Other classrooms will have a capacity between 20-24 students.

**7. What are your drop-off and dismissal procedures?**

Our Pre-K 3 & 4 students are required to be accompanied by an authorized adult and an authorized adult must pick them up. ID's are checked before any student is released by the teacher.

**8. Is there a dress code?**

Yes, the Pre-K 3&4 and grades K-8 follow a school wide uniform policy; uniforms are purchased at [www.globalschoolwear.com](http://www.globalschoolwear.com) our school code is **STPA10**

**9. What is your behavior management policy?**

Discipline expectations may be found in our school handbook; individual teachers implement these in an age-appropriate manner. Bullying/harassment of any type is not tolerated.

**10. Can you bring hot lunches? What are your policies about allergies and snacks?**

Our school has a daily hot lunch program through Campus Cuisine. Lunches may be purchased for each upcoming week; milk is also available for purchase. Students may bring lunch from home, but teachers cannot heat up lunches; we recommend using a thermos for hot items. Allergies are handled on a case-by-case situation; all students should bring a healthy snack from home; snacks are only provided by the school in the

after-school program.

**11. What special programs do you offer?**

Our school offers special classes in Art, Computer, Library, Phys. Ed, and Spanish. Extracurricular activities are available to different age groups depending on participation, including Cross Country, Drama, Chess Club, Dance and additional after-school enrichment based on level of interest.

**12. Do all students participate in prayer and Mass?**

Yes, all students participate in prayer services, monthly masses and daily prayer times in the classroom.
